# Warning Against Boastfulness - James 4:13-17 Amplified Bible

<sup>13</sup> Come now [and pay attention to this], you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and carry on our business and make a profit." <sup>14</sup> Yet you do not know [the least thing] about what may happen in your life tomorrow. [What is secure in your life?] You are *merely* a vapor [like a puff of smoke or a wisp of steam from a cooking pot] that is visible for a little while and then vanishes [into thin air]. <sup>15</sup> Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and we will do this or that." <sup>16</sup> But as it is, you boast [vainly] in your pretension *and* arrogance. All such boasting is evil. <sup>17</sup> So any person who knows what is right to do but does not do it, to him it is sin.

**Boast** – talk with excessive pride and self-satisfaction about one's achievements, possessions or abilities, to praise oneself extravagantly in speech: speak of oneself with excessive pride

Pretension - claim or assertion, allegation of doubtful value

**Arrogance** – attitude of superiority manifested in an overbearing manner, offensive display of superiority or self-importance

## Why is this subject important to James and to God? Why does he need to warn us about boastfulness?

**Important to James** – starts out come now (pay attention), saying something of value for us to take note of for our lives

Two main parts - What not to do (verses 4:13-14), What to do (verses 4:15-17)

#### What not to do

# Verse 14a – <u>What may happen tomorrow</u>

Proverbs 27:1 NIV 27 Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring.

Isaiah 46:10 New Living Translation <sup>10</sup> Only I can tell you the future before it even happens. Everything I

plan will come to pass, for I do whatever I wish.

Jeremiah 29:11 Contemporary English Version <sup>11</sup> I will bless you with a future filled with hope - a future of success, not of suffering.

# Verse 14b - Life is short – proper perspective on life/time

**Psalm 39:5 Common English Bible** <sup>5</sup> You've made my days so short; my lifetime is like nothing in your eyes. Yes, a human life is nothing but a puff of air!

**Psalm 90:4** NIV <sup>4</sup> A thousand years in your sight are like a day that has just gone by, or like a watch in the night.

# What to do - three things we should say - we shouldn't be so presumptive

If the Lord wills – sovereignty, omniscient, control, authority (Psalm 24:1 NLT) (Ephesians 5:17 NKJV)
We will live – preserves our lives (Psalm 66:9 NIV), keeps us among the living (AMP), Acts 17:28 (CEV)
We will do this and that – should be in alignment with God's will, (John 6:35 Message), behavior & plans should consistently demonstrate dependence upon the Lord

## How do we align ourselves with God's will?

What to boast about	What not to boast about
In God - Psalm 44:8 NKJV	Evil desires – Psalm 10:3
Understanding to know Him - Jer. 9:24	Wealth – Psalm 49:6
In the hope of the glory of God – Romans 5:2	Idols – Psalm 97:7
In the Lord -1 Cor. 1:31	Tomorrow – Proverbs 27:1
Weakness – 2 Cor. 11:30	Wisdom, Strength, Riches – Jer. 9:23
Cross – Galatians 6:14	Themselves – 2 Peter 2:18

## Verse 17 - So any person who knows what is right to do but does not do it, to him it is sin.

Addresses a lack of submission to God's will, which is called sin (Gr hamartia), "to miss the mark", "to err". Considered sin of omission.

## James 4:18-5:6 Amplified Bible - Misuse of Riches

5 Come [quickly] now, you rich [who lack true faith and hoard and misuse your resources], weep and howl over the miseries [the woes, the judgments] that are coming upon you. <sup>2</sup> Your wealth has rotted *and* is ruined and your [fine] clothes have become moth-eaten. <sup>3</sup> Your gold and silver are corroded, and their corrosion will be a witness against you and will consume your flesh like fire. You have stored up your treasure in the last days [when it will do you no good]. <sup>4</sup> Look! The wages that you have [fraudulently] withheld from the laborers who have mowed your fields are crying out [against you for vengeance]; and the cries of the harvesters have come to the ears of <sup>[a]</sup>the Lord of Sabaoth. <sup>5</sup> On the earth you have lived luxuriously *and* abandoned yourselves to soft living and led a life of wanton pleasure [self-indulgence, self-gratification]; you have fattened your hearts in a day of slaughter. <sup>6</sup> You have condemned and have put to death the righteous *man*; he offers you no resistance.
