Welcome to the 21-Day Challenge 2026: 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting!

If you are reading this devotional, I believe it is because you desire a deeper and more intimate relationship with God. I want to commend you and assure you that you have chosen the right path—setting aside the next 21 days for fervent, focused, and passionate pursuit of divine intimacy. This booklet is designed to be a powerful companion on that journey.

Our 21 days of fasting and prayer in 2026 center on the theme “Greater Things”, drawn from Jesus’ promise in John 14:12—our Word for the Year. This devotional provides a thematic and progressive journey that moves from identity → intimacy → empowerment → impact. Each day builds upon the previous one, guiding you step-by-step into God’s blueprint for walking in the greater works He has prepared for us as individuals and as a church. Along the way, you will engage with foundational Christian disciplines such as prayer, fasting, holiness, generosity, and obedience—each one a vital key to experiencing greater things.

This booklet also includes tools to enrich your experience, including the 1-hour prayer model located on page two. Every day’s devotional contains a central Bible passage, a brief reflection designed to stir your heart, and prayer points to strengthen your daily communion with God. If you long for a greater dimension of intimacy with Him, you have in your hands a tool that can help you get there.

If you received this devotional by January 4th, 2026, I invite you to join the Agape House of Worship Family of Churches for our daily corporate prayer, held from 6:00 pm to 6:45 pm EST, January 4th through 24th, 2026. You can join via teleconference at 908-293-8320. We will conclude our fast with a powerful All-Day Prayer Gathering on January 24th, from 8:30 am to 6:00 pm, at the AHOW Main Sanctuary in Roselle, New Jersey.

“Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father.”

~ John 14:12 (NKJV)

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Welcome to 2026, our year of GREATER WORKS. Through this 21-day devotional you will be enlightened about the meaning, implication and purpose of “Greater Works”. The purpose of fasting is not to force God to do what we want Him to do, but to seek His face and understand His ways. Fasting is a physical act of obedience that brings our spirit, soul and body together to position ourselves to experience God in a new way. Hence, I am challenging you to be focused and expectant as you participate in this challenge.

TYPE OF FAST: The 21-day fast will be a normal fast, which implies going without food every day until after the corporate prayer which will end around 6:45pm. During this period, you can drink water, tea, coffee, or juice moderately. You can make adjustment and break your fast early (like 3pm) based on health reasons. Fasting is not an obligation; it is about a relationship and connecting to God in a more powerful way through prayer and meditation on God’s Word. As we pray and read God’s Word, we are drawing closer to God and positioning ourselves to hear from Him clearer as we look forward to a wonderful 2026.

PERSONAL PRAYER: Individuals are encouraged to spend at least 1 hour every day to read the bible passage and pray before the corporate prayer times. See the table below for a recommended 1-hour prayer model sample.

CORPORATE PRAYER TIMES: Our corporate prayer time will be 6pm – 6:45pm (teleconference #908-293-8320) daily except for the 21st day.

TONGUES OF FIRE PRAYER CONFERENCE: On the last day of the Challenge, which is January 24, 2026, we will hold an all-day prayer conference from 8:30AM – 6:00PM. The venue is the Church sanctuary.

Called to Greater Things**John 14:8-14**

Key Passage: *John 14:12 - “Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father.” ~ (NIV)*

Reflection: When Jesus spoke these words to His disciples, He was not speaking to spiritual elites or seasoned apostles. He was speaking to ordinary men; fishermen, a tax collector, everyday people with weaknesses, doubts, and limitations like us. Yet He looked at them and declared: **“You will do the works I do — and even greater.”** What an astonishing promise!

The implication of this is that greater things do not begin with ability; they begin with **belief**. Jesus said, *“he who believes in Me”* The foundation of greater works is a heart anchored in faith, and confident in Christ’s character. Many believers disqualify themselves because they feel inadequate, unworthy, or unprepared. But Jesus never asked us to believe in our own strength but to believe in Him.

As this 21-day fast begins, let your heart awaken to the truth that **you are called to do greater things**. The call to greater things is not for some, it is for *every* believer and for you. It is for individuals and for us corporately as a church. God has prepared works for you to walk in, and fasting positions your heart to recognize and embrace them. Over the next 21 days, you will see that greater works begin with:

- A deeper revelation of Jesus
- A surrendered heart
- A life aligned with His will
- A willingness to say “yes”

Let’s kickoff this wonderful adventure today by declaring: **“Lord, I believe Your promise. Do Your greater work in me.”**

1. Thank God for calling you into Your greater works, not because of your qualification but because of His grace and mercy.
2. Ask God to fill you with faith and increase my faith to believe everything He have spoken. 2 Corinthians 4:13
3. Ask God to remove every lie, fear, and limitation that keeps you from embracing His call for greater works. 2 Timothy 1:7
4. Dedicate this season of fast to God. Pray that this fast will awaken fresh hunger for Jesus in your heart.
5. Ask God to help you to see yourself as He sees you — capable through Christ. Philippians 4:13
6. Ask God to prepare you for major breakthroughs and spiritual growth in these next 21 days of prayer and consecration.
7. Ask God to do greater things in your life, family, and AHOWFC this year.

Knowing the Greater One in You

1 John 4:1-6

Key Verse: *1 John 4:4 “You are of God, little children, and have overcome them, because He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world.” (NKJV)*

Reflection: For those still asking, how is greater work possible? This passage should encourage you. The **greater One lives inside of you**. The Holy Spirit is not merely a helper or comforter; He is the very power of God dwelling within you. Too often, believers strive to live the Christian life in their own strength, trying harder, pushing more, attempting to be spiritual through human efforts. But greater things never flow from human effort; they flow from **divine indwelling**.

John reminds us here that the Spirit who lives in us is **greater** than any challenge, temptation, system, or opposition in the world. Before God does greater works *through* you, He wants to reveal the greater One *in* you. You are not alone on this journey. The Spirit empowers your prayers, strengthens your devotion, fuels your obedience, and gives you victory in spiritual battles.

Fasting heightens your awareness of His presence, quietens the noise of the flesh, and allow the voice of the Spirit to become much clearer. As you go through this 21-day challenge, expect deeper encounters with Him. Expect new clarity, fresh conviction, renewed strength, and divine guidance. Greater things come from:

- Walking with the Spirit
- Listening to His voice
- Yielding to His leading
- Depending on His strength

Today, rest in this truth: **Greater works are possible because the Greater One lives in me.**

1. Thank God for the revelation of the Greater One in you. Thank God for the ministry of the Holy Spirit, making us aware and reminding us of the Greater One in us.
2. Pray that the Holy Spirit will give you a greater awareness of God's presence, power and provision in your life. Ephesians 1:18-19
3. Pray that God will deliver you from reliance on self. Ask God to help you to rely on His strength and not on your own. 2 Corinthians 3:5
4. Declare and silence every voice of fear, doubt, and confusion in your life that prevents you from seeing and embracing God's view of you. Psalm 139:14
5. Pray that God will sharpen your sense of hearing in the spirit and teach you to hear His voice clearly. Isaiah 30:21
6. Pray for a fresh infilling of the power of the Holy Spirit. Ask God to fill you with fresh power for this season. Acts 1:8
7. Pray that God would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might by His Spirit in your inner man. Ephesians 3:16

Aligning with the Father's Will

John 5:17–24

Key Verse: *John 5:19* - "Jesus gave them this answer: "Very truly I tell you, the Son can do nothing by himself; he can do only what he sees his Father doing, because whatever the Father does the Son also does." (NIV)

Reflection: If there is anything to learn in the passage, it is that even Jesus, the Son of God did not perform greater works by His independent effort. He lived in perfect alignment with the Father's will. Hence, He said, "*I do nothing of Myself.*" If Jesus modeled dependence, how much more must we?

Greater works are not accomplished by ambition, zeal, or ministry activity. They come from **alignment**, which is seeing what the Father is doing and joining Him. I am praying that this fasting and prayer season will tune your heart to Heaven's frequency. I pray they will quiet the noise so you can discern God's desire, timing, and direction. One of the things fasting does is to weaken our flesh and strengthen our inner man. Many believers simply want God to bless *their* plans, but greater works flow when we embrace *His* plans. Alignment means:

- Surrendering your will
- Yielding your plans
- Trusting His wisdom
- Obeying His voice

As you continue this fast, expect God to speak. He may give new direction or correct your path. He may reveal habits to lay down or spiritual disciplines to strengthen. This is His loving way of aligning you for greater things. When your heart aligns with the Father, your life becomes a vessel through which His power flows through effortlessly and greater things happen.

1. Thank God because you know He has great plans for you.... "Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future" in Christ. Jeremiah 29:11
2. Pray and ask the Father to align your heart with His will for you in every area of your life. Proverbs 3:5-6
3. Pray that God will help you to see what He is doing around you so you can join Him in it. John 5:19
4. Pray that God will remove every form of self-reliance and pride that takes you out of alignment with the Father. 1 Peter 5:6
5. Pray that the Holy Spirit will teach you to walk in obedience and sensitivity to His voice. John 10:27
6. Pray and ask God to reveal any area where you are out of alignment with His purpose and give you the grace to make amend. Psalm 139:23
7. Pray that God will order your steps and lead you into His plans in 2025. Psalm 23:3. Pray that His will be done in your life and in AHOWFC.

Living A Life of Total Surrender

Romans 12:1-8

Key Verse: *Romans 12:1 - "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service." (NKJV)*

Reflection: Today we are going take look at the word “Surrender”. Greater works require a **greater surrender**. In our passage today, Paul urges believers to present their bodies (meaning their entire lives) as a *living sacrifice* to God. The Old Testament sacrifices were placed on the altar once, but here, God is calling us to live continually on the altar, yielding every part of our lives to Him.

Surrender is not weakness; it is the pathway to supernatural strength. When you surrender, you exchange your limited ability for God’s unlimited power. You release control and allow the Holy Spirit to shape your desires, decisions, habits, and direction. Many believers want God to use them but still hold tightly to attitudes, relationships, ambitions, or habits that limit what God can do. I believe God wants to use this fast to expose these areas in our lives. He wants to reveal attachments, distractions, and patterns that hinder spiritual progress. I challenge you during these 21 day-challenge to ask the Lord: *“What are You calling me to surrender so that I may walk in Your greater works?”*

Surrender leads to transformation. Paul says that when your mind is renewed, you will discern the will of God which is the very foundation for “greater things”.

Surrender is not loss; it is gain. It positions you for greater influence, greater authority, and greater intimacy with God. God does greater things through surrendered vessels. Today, choose to place your life afresh on the altar.

1. Thank God for His love for you is pure, good and everlasting. Jeremiah 31:3
2. Tell God "Lord Jesus, I surrender my whole life to You. I give You my past, my present, and my future, my joys and my sorrows, my strengths and my weaknesses. Take my will and make it Your own, my heart and fill it with Your love, my mind and renew it with Your truth."
3. Ask God to remove anything in you that hinders His will. Ask Him to uproot sin, negative patterns, and anything that obstructs, from you. Psalm 139:23-24
4. Pray that the Holy Spirit will help you to release control and trust Him fully. Ask him to take over your worries, plans, and future. Invite Him to guide your mind, heart, and actions with power and peace. Proverbs 3:5-6
5. Pray that God will make your life a vessel that He can fill and use for His good works. 2 Timothy 2:21
6. Pray that God will give you the faith and strength you need to obey even when it costs you something. Philippians 2:8
7. Pray and confess that, Father, I place myself on Your altar—use me for greater things this year and beyond.

Cultivating Intimacy with Jesus

John 15:1-10

Key Verse: *John 15:4 - "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me." (NKJV)*

Reflection: Greater works are not achieved by human effort but by abiding in Jesus. Abiding means living in continuous fellowship with Him; loving Him, seeking Him, depending on Him, and drawing strength from His presence. In this scripture, Jesus uses the picture of a vine and branches to remind us that spiritual fruitfulness flows from connection, not performance.

Unfortunately, many believers desire power without presence, miracles without intimacy, and success without relationship. We must know that intimacy is the well from which greater works flow. The disciples did not just learn from Jesus, they lived with Him, walked with Him, listened to Him, and loved Him. They were first changed by His presence before they were able to change the world.

The goal of this consecration time is to stir you away from quiet distractions and closer to Jesus and so your heart may hear His whisper. It is to sensitize your spirit to His leading and deepen your love for Him. I want to encourage you to make time to sit quietly with Jesus, read His Word slowly, worship Him intentionally, and talk with Him honestly. This is what abiding is.

The power of the early church was not in their strategies but in their intimacy with Christ and the Holy Spirit. The more you abide, the more His life flows through you, producing fruit you could never create on your own. Greater works begin with one simple decision: to stay close to Jesus every day. Will you make this decision today?

1. Thank God for making us part of Him, a branch attached to the vine.
2. Ask God to draw you into deeper intimacy with Him. And to help you to see the world as He sees it and give you a heart receptive to His Word. James 4:8
3. Ask God to help you to abide in His presence daily. Acknowledge that you can do nothing without Him and ask Him to fill your day with His peace and life, just like a branch draws life from the vine. John 15:4
4. Pray that God will remove everything that distracts you (such as energy-draining relationships/attachments, worldly cares (money, busyness), from fellowship with Him. Matthew 6:33, Mark 4:18-19
5. Ask God to fill you with fresh love, passion, and hunger for Christ that cannot be quenched by anything. Romans 5:5, Matthew 5:6
6. Ask God to teach you to hear His voice more clearly. And help you choose to be still, to quiet your mind and heart, and listen to His voice. Psalm 46:10
7. Pray that through your intimacy with Him, His grace will flow to be fruitful spiritually, physically, biologically. John 15:5

The Power of Fasting and Prayer

Matthew 6:5-18

Key Verse: *Matthew 6:18* “so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Father, who is unseen; and your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.” – (NIV)

Reflection: Fasting and prayer are not religious duties; they are a powerful spiritual discipline that focuses our mind on things above and realign our heart with God. They shift atmospheres, unlock breakthroughs and destroy strongholds. From our passage today, Jesus didn't say “If you fast” but “When you fast.” This implies fasting is expected of every believer because it is a pathway to deeper intimacy and spiritual empowerment.

Fasting weakens your flesh (your carnal nature) and strengthens your spirit man. It sharpens spiritual sensitivity and breaks the grip of bad habits, temptations, and distractions. When combined with fervent prayer, fasting amplifies your spiritual capacity to hear God, resist the enemy, operate in faith, carry the anointing and wield your spiritual authority.

Many of the great works recorded in Scripture such as deliverances, miracles, revelations, and divine directions were preceded by fasting. Jesus Himself fasted before beginning His ministry (Luke 4:1-14). The early church fasted when appointing leaders and seeking God's direction (Acts 13:1-3). Fasting prepares the vessel so that God can pour out fresh oil.

I believe strongly that these 21 days will position us for personal and corporate breakthroughs. Expect clarity, renewal and spiritual victories. Expect God to move in your life. Let this fast not be just a physical discipline but a spiritual pursuit, a hunger for God to do greater things in you and through you. May the Lord deepen your hunger for Him during this challenge.

1. It's Day 6 of our 21-day fast, thank God for His sustaining grace; for the great things He has done, He is doing and will still do in you.
2. Ask God for grace and strength to continue this fast with sincerity and purpose, and to make the best of this season of consecration.
3. Ask God to baptize you afresh with the spirit of grace and prayer and take your prayer life to the next level. Zechariah 12:10
4. Pray that God will break every form of spiritual resistance and stagnation in your life and break you free from inactivity and spiritual bondage. 2 Cor.10:4
5. Pray that God will use this fast produce lasting spiritual transformation in your life and take you to the next level in your walk with God. Isaiah 58:6
6. Pray that this fast will release the spirit of breakthroughs in your life, your family, your ministry, and AHOWFC. Isaiah 58:6
7. Pray that God will reward this sacrifice with fresh power and grace for greater works individually and corporately. Acts 4:33

The Word: Blueprint For Greater Works

Joshua 1:1–9

Key Verse: Joshua 1:8 “*This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate in it day and night, that you may observe to do according to all that is written in it. For then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have good success.*” (NKJV)

Reflection: The Word of God is the **foundation of all greater works**. Every miracle Jesus performed aligned with Scripture. Every teaching He gave fulfilled the prophecy of the scriptures. Every act of power in the early church flowed from obedience to the Word. The Word of God has been given to us as the raw material for producing greater works.

Joshua was about to lead Israel into the greatest assignment of his life which is conquering the Promised Land. God did not give him military strategies, political advice, or leadership manuals. He gave him one instruction: “**This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth.**” He was told to meditate on it, speak it, obey it, and live by it. The Word of God builds faith, renews the mind, guides decisions, strengthens character, and exposes the enemy’s lies. Without the Word, believers drift. With the Word, believers conquer.

As we go through this exercise of 21-day challenge, let the Word anchor you. Read it with expectation, meditate on it slowly, write down what God shows you, speak it out loud, align your life with its truth. If you want to do greater things, you must fill your heart with the words of the One who promised greater things. Your spiritual effectiveness is directly connected to your relationship with the Word of God. I challenge you to take your relationship with the Word seriously.

1. Thank God for His word which God has given to us as a source of guidance, wisdom, comfort, and life transformation. Psalm 19:7-8
2. Ask God to give you a fresh hunger for His Word. Pray that He will create in you a new desire for His truth and help you crave it more than anything the world offers. 1 Peter 2:2
3. Pray for the spirit of wisdom and understanding in the Word. Ask God to open your eyes to see wondrous things in Scripture. Psalm 119:18
4. Ask God for grace to become a doer of His Word. Pray that God will give you a mentality of radical obedience to His Word regales of what is going on in your life. James 1:22-25
5. Pray that the Word of God will guide every decision you will make in 2026. All your decisions will be rooted in God’s Word.
6. Pray for grace and courage to take God at His word and to build a strong faith for greater things through His promises. Luke 5:5
7. Pray that God’s Word will shape your thoughts, your life, your habits, your decisions and your destiny. Romans 12:2

The Purity that Precedes Power

1 Corinthians 16:5-18

Key Verse: *2 Timothy 2:21 “If a man therefore purge himself from these, he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified, and meet for the master's use, and prepared unto every good work.” (NKJV)*

Reflection: There is a direct connection between **purity and power**. God does not pour His anointing into vessels that resist His sanctifying work. In the passage above, Apostle Paul tells Timothy that anyone who cleanses himself becomes a vessel God can trust with greater assignments. It's important to know, however, that purity is not about perfection; **it is about yieldedness**. God is the one who does the supernatural work of sanctification. Your role is to continually allow the Holy Spirit to shape your character, correct your course, and purify your motives.

It's also important to note that holiness is not a burden, it is a blessing. It protects your calling, guards your heart, strengthens your witness, and positions you for greater impact. When your heart is pure, your spiritual authority increases. When your motives are pure, God can trust you with greater influence. When your lifestyle is pure, the enemy loses his foothold.

One of the great things about fasting is that it helps expose impurities that often go unnoticed in our lives such as pride, impatience, unforgiveness, lust, compromise, harmful habits, or spiritual laziness. These 21 days are an opportunity to allow God to cleanse your heart, renew your mind, and purify your desires. Greater things flow through clean vessels. Impurity render God's power ineffective in your life. God longs to work mightily through those who pursue holiness with humility and sincerity. Would you say to the Lord today: **“Cleanse me, refine me, and make me a vessel fit for Your use.”**

1. Ask God to reveal any hidden sins in your life and to cleanse you thoroughly, so that nothing blocks the flow of His power through you. 1 John 1:9
2. Pray that God will create in you a genuine love for purity that surpasses any fleeting desire for worldly compromise. Hebrews 1:9
3. Pray that God will guard your heart and mind against contamination, knowing that pure thoughts lead to powerful living. Proverbs 4:23
4. Ask God for power to resist temptation and grace to always be quick to reject evil and choose good and flee immorality. 1 Corinthians 10:13
5. Pray that as you walk in purity, the Holy Spirit will anoint you afresh to do His work with effectiveness and authority. 2 Timothy 1:7
6. Ask God to make you a vessel of honor, sanctified, thoroughly furnish and useful for every good work. 2 Timothy 2:21
7. Pray that grace for purity will rest upon AHOWFC young and old, such that impurity such as sexual immorality, greed, obscenity, foolish talk, coarse joking will not be found among us as God's holy people. Eph.5:3-5

Walking In Obedience

John 2:1-11

Key Verse: *John 2:5* “His mother said to the servants, “Whatever He says to you, do it.” (NKJV)

Reflection: Obedience is the bridge between revelation and manifestation. It is not enough for God to reveal His will to us, we must respond with obedience. Mary’s instruction at the wedding in Cana captures the heart of greater works: “Whatever He says to you, do it.” It’s important to note that miracle did not happen because the servants understood Jesus, it happened because they obeyed Him. “Greater works” is always a product of obedience.

Obedience unlocks the supernatural. When Abraham obeyed God, nations were blessed. When Moses obeyed God, the Red Sea parted. When Peter obeyed God, thousands were saved after Pentecost. When the early church obeyed, the gospel spread across the world and many miracles happened. Imagine what can happen when you and I choose to obey God.

Obedience often requires faith, surrender, and discomfort. God may ask you to forgive someone, step out in evangelism, give generously, change a habit, pray for a sick person or serve in a new area. He may prompt you to spend more time in prayer or to let go of something that pulls your heart away. Every act of obedience opens the door to greater works.

In 2026, I want you to posture your heart to hear and obey. God speaks to those who are willing to respond. When your spirit says “yes” to God, miracles follow. Pray for the grace to obey even when you don’t fully understand knowing that your obedience will produce divine outcomes.

1. Pray that the Lord will give you a heart that honors and delights in obedience and abhors any form of disobedience. Hebrews 1:9
2. Pray for a deeper understanding of God’s Word and a revelation of the importance and blessing of obedience in your life. Psalm 119:105.
3. Ask for a willing heart and the strength to respond promptly and faithfully to God’s guidance. Isaiah 1:19.
4. Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal any areas in your life where you are not fully aligned with God’s will and give you the desire to make those changes. Psalm 139:23-24.
5. Ask God for the courage to step out in faith and obey Him, even when the path is unclear or challenging. Proverbs 3:5-6.
6. Pray for faith to believe that God is able to do miraculous things in your life as you walk in obedience to Him. Mark 9:23.
7. Make a commitment to live a lifestyle of obedience, trusting that as you do, you will experience God’s miraculous work in your life. John 14:21

Renewing The Mindset for Greater Works

Romans 12:1–8

Key Verse: *Romans 12:2* "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." (NIV)

Reflection: Greater works require a **greater mindset**. You cannot walk in the supernatural while thinking naturally. You cannot live in victory while thinking in defeat. Transformation begins internally in you before it manifests externally. In our passage today, Apostle Paul tells us that we must be transformed by the renewing of our minds. If you are wondering what this means, it means allowing God's truth to replace false beliefs, limiting thoughts, and worldly perspectives. Many believers cannot step into greater things because their minds are still shaped by past failures, childhood wounds, cultural thinking, spiritual ignorance and the lies that the enemy planted in their minds.

Renewing the mind is the lifelong process of aligning your thoughts with God's Word until His truth becomes your reality. It happens through meditation, confession, study, and obedience to Scripture. As your mind is renewed:

- Your faith increases
- Your fears diminish
- Your hope grows
- Your perspective shifts
- Your decisions align with God's will

One of the most important prayers a believer can pray is to ask the Holy Spirit to expose wrong mindsets — fear, unbelief, scarcity, insecurity, doubt, or unworthiness. Replace them with God's promises of power, purpose, identity, and victory. Greater works begin with a renewed mind. Think as God thinks, and you will walk as Jesus walked.

1. Ask God for forgiveness where you have settled for small thinking, and made Him small, weak and incapable. Ephesians 4:22.
2. Pray that your mind will not be conformed to the patterns of this world but will be continually transformed by the renewal of your mind. Romans 12:2.
3. Pray that God will dismantle every stronghold of fear, unbelief, and everything that exalts itself against the knowledge of God. 2 Cor.10:4-5
4. Ask God for grace to cultivate a mindset of abundance and possibility, not limited by perceived scarcity and environment. Ephesians 3:20
5. Ask God for grace to develop intentional discipline in your thought life so that the mind of Christ be formed in you.
6. Declare your identity in Christ, you can do all things through Christ who strengthens you enable you to achieve the greater works. Philippians 4:13.
7. Pray for boldness to act on your renewed mindset. Pray for the infilling of the Holy Spirit to speak the Word of God with faith and courage. Acts 4:31.

The Power of Faith and Expectation

Mark 11:20-26

Key Verse: *Mark 11:22 -23 – ““Have faith in God,” Jesus answered. 23 Truly I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, ‘Go, throw yourself into the sea,’ and does not doubt in their heart but believes that what they say will happen, it will be done for them.” (NIV)*

Reflection: Faith is the currency of the Kingdom. It is the essential ingredient for anything God desires to do in your life. Hebrews tell us that without faith it is impossible to please God. Jesus consistently linked miracles to faith—not to talent, intellect, or spiritual maturity. When people believed, the impossible became possible. When they doubted, even the Son of God could not do mighty works among them.

In Mark 11, Jesus teaches the disciples that faith moves mountains. Mountains represent obstacles, limitations, resistance, and impossibilities. Faith does not ignore the problem—it speaks to it with full confidence in God’s power, wisdom, and love. Faith expects God to act. Expectation is faith’s posture. It is the inner conviction that God will do what He promised. Many people pray without expectation, fast without expectation, and serve without expectation. But greater works manifest where there is bold, joyful, unwavering expectation.

During this fast, God wants to stretch your faith. He wants to move you from survival-level faith to mountain-moving faith. From “Lord, if You can...” to “Lord, because You said...” Faith grows when fed with Scripture, strengthened through prayer, and exercised through obedience. What mountains stand before you today—fear, sickness, delay, financial struggle, family issues, spiritual dryness? Speak the Word in faith. Believe that God is faithful. Expect Him to move. Greater things require greater faith. Let this be the season your faith rises to a new dimension.

1. Ask God to deliver you from negative expectations rooted in past hurts, disappointment. Ask Him to replace fear with confident hope. 1 Peter 5:7
2. Pray just like the apostles did, "Increase our faith!" that you may operate not by the world's standards, but by the measure of faith Luke 17:5; Rom 12:3.
3. Pray for grace to hold fast the confession of your hope without wavering, knowing that He who promised is faithful and will do as promised. Heb.10:23
4. Ask God to baptize you with the same spirit of faith which will cause you to speak your expectations into existence by God's power. 2 Corinthians 4:13
5. Pray that your faith will allow you to see the invisible and achieve the impossible. Hebrews 11:1
6. Pray that you walk by faith, not by sight, and expect the Holy Spirit to lead you and guide you into all truth daily (2 Corinthians 5:7; John 16:13).
7. Ask God to give you faith to ask Him for greater things in 2026. Psalm 2:8

Living A Life of Love

1 Corinthians 13:1–13

Key Verse: 1 Corinthians 13:13 “*And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.*”

Reflection: Greater works are rooted in greater love. The love we are talking about here is not merely an emotion or a virtue—it is the very nature of God known as “Agape Love”. Everything Jesus did flowed from Agape. His miracles, teachings, healings, compassion, patience, and sacrifice all originated from a heart full of love for the Father and for people.

1 Corinthians 13 is a sobering passage. Here Apostle Paul reminds us that spiritual gifts, supernatural power, and impressive ministry mean nothing without Agape love. Agape is the measure of true greatness in the Kingdom. This love fuels generosity, ignites compassion, empowers forgiveness, and inspires service. Fasting is not only about seeking God’s power; it is also about allowing Him to soften and transform our hearts so that His love can flow through us. As you fast, you may become more aware of impatience, frustration, harshness, or self-centeredness. This is God inviting you to grow in love.

Greater works require hearts that reflect Christ. When we love deeply, we pray boldly. When we love sincerely, we serve joyfully. When we love sacrificially, God moves through us powerfully. No wonder Apostle Paul prays for us in Ephesians 3:17-19 that we might know His love that passes knowledge so we may be filled with all the fulness of God. Ask God today to enlarge your heart so you may love as Jesus loved—with purity, compassion, humility, and endurance. Love makes room for God to work.

1. Pray that Christ may dwell in your heart through faith—that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ. Ephesians 3:17-18
2. Pray that God’s love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us. Romans 5:5
3. Pray that the revelation of God’s love will heal any wounds that hinder you from loving others the way God loves you. Psalm 147:3
4. Pray specifically for the practical application of love in everyday life: that your love is patient, your love is kind, and that it keeps no record of wrongs 1 Corinthians 13:4-5.
5. Ask God to remove bitterness, anger, and unforgiveness from your heart so you can flow in love. Hebrews 12:15
6. Ask God to teach you to reflect Christ’s love in the way you leave, in your family and in the church.
7. Pray that the supernatural love of God will flow through you to heal, set free and draw others to repentance. Ephesians 5:2

The Discipline of Generosity

2 Corinthians 9:6-15

Key Verse: *2 Corinthians 9:7 “Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ” – NIV*

Reflection: Today we are going to talk about generosity. Generosity is a powerful spiritual discipline that aligns us with the heart of God and positions us for greater works. God is a giver—He gave His Son, He gives grace, and He gives blessings and opportunities. When we give, we reflect His character and participate in His Kingdom agenda.

Here and throughout his epistles, Paul teaches that generosity is both a seed and a sacrifice. When you give joyfully and willingly, God multiplies your seed and enriches your life—not only materially but spiritually. Generosity breaks the grip of greed, fear, and scarcity mentality. It opens doors for divine provision and supernatural breakthroughs.

One of the purposes of a fast is to break the grip of material and carnal things on our mind and awaken our minds to heavenly things. During a fast, God often calls His people to give, whether finances, time, service, or compassion. Generosity expands your capacity to receive and be used by God. Many of the “greater works” Jesus calls us to involve acts of mercy, compassion, and sacrificial giving.

Generosity is a lifestyle, not a moment. It is choosing to bless others even when you feel you don’t have enough. It is trusting that God will supply all your needs. It is sowing sacrificially into the Kingdom with expectation. Greater works require generous hearts—because God works through those who freely release what He freely gives.

1. Pray for the wisdom to honor the Lord with your wealth and first fruits, trusting that your provisions will be plentiful. Proverbs 3:9-10.
2. Command every fear or hesitation regarding giving to leave you, remembering that the Lord has not given you a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind. 2 Timothy 1:7
3. Pray that you see giving as worship and obedience to God, understanding that obedience is better than sacrifice. 1 Samuel 15:22
4. Declare that the Lord multiplies every seed you sow for His glory, because He is the one who supplies seed to the Sower and bread for food. 2 Cor. 9:10
5. Pray for your family and church, that generosity overflows in them so they may be rich in every way to be generous on every occasion. 2 Cor. 9:11
6. Pray that God uses your giving specifically to bless lives and expand His kingdom, just as His word accomplishes what He desires. [Isaiah 55:11]
7. Declare that the Father supplies all your needs according to His riches in glory in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4:19

Living With Kingdom Priorities

Matthew 6:25–34

Key Verse: *Matthew 6:33 “But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.” – NKJV*

Reflection: Greater works do not emerge from scattered living but from **focused living**. Jesus teaches us to seek *first* the Kingdom of God—not second, not third, not occasionally, but first. Our priorities reveal our passions. When God’s Kingdom becomes our first pursuit, greater things naturally follow.

Unfortunately, many believers are overwhelmed by the cares of life, worry, stress, busyness, financial pressure, and fear of the future. These distractions suffocate faith, choke spiritual growth and prevent you from moving in spiritual power. Jesus invites us to release anxiety and anchor our lives in His Kingdom. When God’s priorities become your priorities, He handles everything else.

Fasting helps realign misplaced priorities. It reveals what has occupied your heart and time. It simplifies your life and sharpens your focus. During these 21 days, allow God to reset your priorities—your schedule, habits, finances, relationships, and spiritual routines.

When you seek God first, you begin to see His hand in every area of your life. You experience clarity, provision, peace, and purpose. You become available for greater things because your life is arranged around the Kingdom, not the world. **Greater works flow from Kingdom-first living.** Make Jesus your first pursuit today.

1. Pray that the Lord will reorder your priorities according to His Kingdom, remembering that His Kingdom and righteousness should be sought first above all else. Matthew 6:33
2. Ask God to help you to identify and remove anything that distracts you from seeking Him first. Ask Him to help you to keep your eyes fixed on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. Hebrews 12:2
3. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you to trust God with your daily needs, so you can cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you. 1 Peter 5:7
4. Pray that the Lord will help you focus on what truly matters—things that are above, not on earthly things. Colossians 3:2
5. Declare that His Kingdom purpose guides every decision you make, for you know the plans He has for you, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Jeremiah 29:11
6. Ask for the grace to pursue His righteousness daily, understanding that it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this is not your own doing, it is the gift of God. Ephesians 2:8
7. Command your heart to align with Heaven’s agenda, praying that the will of the Father be done on earth as it is in Heaven starting from you. Matt. 6:10

Empowered By the Holy Spirit

Acts 1:1-11

Key Verse: *Acts 1:8* “But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” (NIV)

Reflection: The call to greater works is impossible without the **power of the Holy Spirit**. Jesus did not allow His disciples to begin the work of the great commission until they received the Spirit. He knew that human enthusiasm, zeal, discipline, or intellect could never accomplish supernatural assignments. Only the Spirit of God empowers believers to do the works of Jesus. Acts 1:8 reveals three key truths:

1. **Power is received, not earned.** The Holy Spirit imparts divine strength, boldness, wisdom, and supernatural gifts.
2. **Power is for purpose.** The Spirit empowers us to be witnesses — to reveal Christ through our lives, words, and works.
3. **Power is progressive.** God expands your influence as you yield more to the Spirit.

Fasting increases your spiritual sensitivity, minimizes the influence of the flesh and create space for the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh. As you deny the flesh, the Spirit gains greater influence in your life. This leads to renewed passion in prayer, deeper conviction, clearer direction, and fresh anointing. The infilling of the Spirit also leads to the stirring of spiritual gifts within you (prophecy, boldness in evangelism, healing, wisdom, or discernment etc.). The Holy Spirit is not optional for greater works — He is essential. Jesus was conceived, anointed, led, empowered, and raised by the Spirit. If Jesus needed the Holy Spirit, so do we. Open your heart and ask Him to fill you today.

1. Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you afresh with His power and presence. Claim the promise to receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. Acts 1:8
2. Repent and ask God to remove anything in your life that resists His work or causes you grieve the Holy Spirit of God. Ephesians 4:30
3. Ask God to teach you stir up every spiritual gift the Lord has placed within you. 2 Timothy 1:6
4. Pray for empowerment to be a bold witness for Jesus. Ask for the same boldness the early believers received to speak the Word of God. Acts 4:31
5. Pray that you will be led by His wisdom and strength in 2026, knowing that those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. Romans 8:14
6. Ask for His anointing to rest upon your life, family, and AHOWFC, for the anointing you received from Him remains in you. 1 John 2:27
7. Ask the Holy Spirit to use you for greater works that glorify Christ. since, believing that whoever believes in Him will do the work He has been doing, and even greater things. John 14:12

Authority In the Name of Jesus**Mark 16:14–20**

Key Verse: *Mark 16:17–18 “And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; 18 they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well.” (NIV)*

Reflection: The name of Jesus is not merely a phrase—it is a spiritual **authority**, a heavenly endorsement, and a divine weapon given to us for greater works. When Jesus ascended, He delegated His authority to believers so that we may continue His works on the earth. The name of Jesus carries the weight of Heaven because it represents His victory, His righteousness, and His position as Lord. Many believers underestimate this authority and live far beneath their spiritual inheritance. But Jesus fully expects His followers to cast out demons, heal the sick, overcome darkness, and stand firm against the enemy, not because of who they are, but because of **whose name they carry**.

When you speak in Jesus’ name with faith, spiritual forces respond. Sickness bows. Fear dissolves. Demonic strongholds break. Doors open. Angels move. Heaven backs your words.

One thing to note about authority is that it flows from relationships, not routine. Hence, the more you walk with Jesus, the more His authority operates through you. Today, speak boldly in His name. Pray boldly in His name. Stand boldly in His name. **Greater works require greater confidence in the power of Jesus’ name.**

1. Ask the Lord to deepen your revelation of the authority in Jesus’ name, knowing that God has seated Him at His right hand in the heavenly realms, far above all rule and authority. Ephesians 1:20-21
2. Ask God to teach you to use this authority with both boldness and humility, remembering that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow. Phil. 2:9-11
3. Command every fear that hinders your spiritual authority to be broken, standing firm in the truth that you have been given authority to trample on snakes and scorpions and to overcome all the power of the enemy. Luke 10:19
4. Declare that the power of Jesus’ name silences every work of darkness around you because the Son of God appeared to destroy the devil’s work. 1 John 3:8
5. Ask God to strengthen your faith to pray confidently in the name of Jesus, believing that whatever you ask in His name, He will do. John 14:13-14
6. Pray that healing, deliverance, and breakthroughs flow through your prayers, knowing that these signs will accompany those who believe. Mark 16:17-18
7. Pray that the name of Jesus be exalted in your life and church, so that in everything He might have the supremacy. Colossians 1:18

Boldness In Witnessing

Acts 4:23-31

Key Verse: *Acts 4:29 "Now, Lord, look on their threats, and grant to Your servants that with all boldness they may speak Your word," (NKJV)*

Reflection: Greater works include sharing the gospel boldly and compassionately with those who do not know Christ. The early church were committed to sharing the gospel. Notice that when they were threatened, they did not pray for safety, comfort, or convenience — they pray for **boldness**. No wonder God responded with so much power such that the place was shaken and they were filled with the Holy Spirit to speak the Word with power.

Godly boldness is not personality trait; it is a product of the Holy Spirit. Even the apostles who walked with Jesus experienced fear and opposition. But the Spirit empowered them to declare the gospel with clarity, conviction, and courage.

Witnessing is one of the greatest works we can ever participate in. Every salvation is a miracle. Every testimony is a manifestation of the gospel's power. God wants to use your voice, your story, and your life to draw others into His Kingdom.

This season and beyond, open your heart to divine opportunities. God will send people across your path who need hope, encouragement, prayer, or truth. Ask Him to make you sensitive to the Spirit and bold in your witness. Boldness is not aggressiveness; it is loving courage. It is the willingness to speak when prompted, to pray when prompted, and to step forward when God opens a door. May God give you the same boldness that filled the early church.

Obedience is the key to walking through open doors even as we trust in God's promises and His timing. If God has opened a door for you, don't hesitate. Obey His call, knowing that He has already prepared the way.

1. Pray that God will fill you with boldness to share the gospel and that words may be given to you so that you will fearlessly preach gospel. Ephesians 6:19
2. Command fear, timidity, and hesitation to leave your spirit. God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind. 2 Tim. 1:7
3. Ask God to open doors for you to witness to family, friends, and coworkers, so that you may speak the mystery of Christ. Colossians 4:3
4. Pray for wisdom and sensitivity when sharing your faith, so that your conversation is always full of grace and seasoned with salt. [Colossians 4:6]
5. Pray that your life will reflect Christ so that others will be drawn to Him and your light shine and glorify your Father in heaven. [Matthew 5:16]
6. Pray for your church to be empowered as effective witnesses in your community, as the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Matthew 5:13-14
7. Pray that many will come to Christ through your witness throughout 2026, trusting that he who wins souls is wise. Proverbs 11:30

Serving Others with Kingdom Purpose

John 13:1-17

Key Verse: *John 13:14-15* “Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another’s feet. 15 I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you.” (NIV)”

Reflection: Greater works flow from a heart that is willing to **serve**. Before Jesus went to the cross, He washed His disciples’ feet—an act that shocked them. The Savior became a servant. The One with all authority stooped low to demonstrate Kingdom greatness. Jesus was teaching us that greater works are not only miraculous acts but also acts of humble service, compassion, and love. The Kingdom advances through those who are willing to serve quietly, faithfully, consistently, and sacrificially.

Serving others positions your heart for more of God. It breaks the grip of selfishness, cultivates a heart of compassion, and aligns your priorities with God’s heart. When you serve others, you resemble Jesus. The Bible encourages us to combine fasting with service. So, as you fast, look for opportunities to serve someone in need. It may be a family member, a ministry in church, a discouraged believer, a neighbor or a coworker.

Serving is not about recognition; it is about obedience. Jesus said, “*If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them.*” The scripture constantly teaches that blessing follows service (Matthew 25:21). Anointing follows service (Acts 10:38). Promotion follows service (Matthew 20:28). Greater works follow service. I pray that the Lord will give you the heart of a servant — a heart like Jesus.

1. Ask the Lord to give you a humble heart like Jesus, who, being in very nature of God, humbled Himself by becoming obedient to death. Philippians 2:5-8
2. Pray for the grace to serve others with joy, sincerity, and wholeheartedly, truly as if you were serving the Lord, not people. Ephesians 6:7
3. Command every trace of selfishness and pride to be removed from your life, and that you will be able fulfil Philippians 2:3, doing nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility valuing others above yourself.
4. Ask the Lord to show you where He wants you to serve in this season. And to show you the work He has prepared in advance for you to do. Psalm 16:11
5. Pray for a fresh anointing to serve with love and compassion, following the example of Christ who did not come to be served, but to serve. Matthew 20:28
6. Pray that your service will reflect Christ to those around you, and that you will use your gift to serve others as faithful stewards of God’s grace. 1 Peter 4:10
7. Pray that God will use your service to open doors for greater works, and that as you stay faithful with a few things, He will put you in charge of many things. Matthew 25:21

Unity And Corporate Anointing

Psalm 133:1-3

Key Passage: *Psalm 133:1 "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is For brethren to dwell together in unity!" – (NKJV)*

Reflection: Greater works are not only personal, but they are also **corporate**. In fact, I believe the context of our main scripture (John 14:12) is meant for the corporate body of Christ. God moves powerfully among people who walk in unity. Psalm 133 teaches that unity attracts God's anointing. Acts 2 shows that the Holy Spirit descended when the disciples were **together in one accord**. Unity creates an atmosphere where Heaven touches earth.

Disunity, offense, division, and strife grieve the Holy Spirit and hinder the flow of God's power. Jesus prayed passionately for the unity of His followers because He knew it would be essential for the mission ahead. Unity does not mean uniformity. It means shared purpose, mutual love, humility, honor, forgiveness, and alignment under Christ.

A united church becomes unstoppable, bold in witness, strong in prayer, effective in service, and powerful in spiritual impact. Unity begins with individual responsibility. Hence, during this fast, I want you to evaluate your relationships: Do you need to forgive someone, restore fellowship, let go of offense or seek reconciliation? Please go ahead and do so. That will be your responsibility towards the unity of the Church. The enemy fears a united church because a united church carries multiplied anointing. I pray that God will make us one, just as Jesus prayed, so that the world may believe.

1. Ask the Lord to unite AHOWFC in love, purpose, and humility, praying that we will be like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Philippians 2:2
2. Pray that God will heal every division, offense, or misunderstanding, and that God will help us make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. Ephesians 4:3
3. Pray that the grace to forgive quickly and fully will flow among us just as the Lord forgave you. Colossians 3:13
4. Pray that God will help us to walk in peace and harmony with others, that we may experience how good and pleasant to live together in unity. Psalm 133:1
5. Pray that God's anointing will flow powerfully through our unity, that we may experience the blessing of unity and even life forevermore. Psalm 133:3
6. Pray that the Lord strengthens AHOWFC leaders and workers to serve together with joy, in the same mind and judgment. 1 Corinthians 1:10
7. Ask God to make AHOWFC a model of Kingdom unity, that the world may know we're Christ's disciples by the love we have for one another. John 13:35

Key Verse: *Matthew 28:19 “Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit” (NKJV)*

Reflection: Greater works are ultimately about **advancing God's Kingdom on earth**. Jesus gave us His followers a clear mission: make disciples, baptize nations, teach the Word, and shine as light in a dark world. This is the heartbeat of the Great Commission, ongoing expansion of God's reign through His people.

Every believer is called to Kingdom impact. Some carry this out by preaching, others by serving, giving, discipling, praying, encouraging, leading, or influencing their workplaces and communities. The Kingdom moves forward wherever God's people step forward in faith and obedience. I pray that this challenge will reawaken your sense of divine purpose, reminding you that your life is not your own and you were saved for a mission. Your gifts, story, resources, and influence are tools God wants to use for His glory. When you align with His Kingdom, greater things become possible and inevitable.

Jesus described us as salt and light, forces that change their environment. Salt preserves, seasons, and heals. Light reveals truth and dispels darkness. You are called to make a difference right where you are. Today, present yourself to God again as a Kingdom instrument. Ask Him to show you where He wants you to shine, serve, speak, and stand. Your life is part of God's global mission. **Greater works advance the Kingdom of God — one act of obedience at a time.**

1. Ask God to use you to advance His Kingdom in your generation, since you were created for good works which God prepared in advance for you. Eph2:10
2. Pray for clarity on your assignment in this season and for the grace to fulfill it, knowing that the steps of a good man are ordered by the Lord. Psalm 37:23
3. Declare that you are salt and light in your home, workplace, and community, letting your light shine before others, so they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. Matthew 5:16
4. Pray for a heart filled with compassion for souls and a passion for discipleship, seeking to go and make disciples of all nations. Matthew 28:19
5. Ask God to open doors for Kingdom influence and impact, praying that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith and that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ. Ephesians 3:17-18
6. Intercede for your church's strength to fulfill the Great Commission, believing that the gospel must first be preached to all nations. Mark 13:10
7. Pray for the Father's Kingdom to come and His will to be done through your life, just as it is in Heaven. Matthew 6:10.

Arise And Do Greater Things!

Isaiah 60:1–7

Key Passage: Isaiah 60:1- “*Arise, shine; For your light has come! And the glory of the LORD is risen upon you.*” ~ (NKJV)

Reflection: You have reached the final day of this 21-day journey, but this is not the end — it is the beginning. These past 21 days have been a time of renewal, purification, alignment, and empowerment. Now God is calling you to *arise*. “Arise” means to get up, step forward, and take your place. It is a call to action. “Shine” means to radiate God’s presence, reflect His character, and release His light into the darkness around you. You carry the glory of the Lord — and glory was never meant to be hidden.

Greater things begin when you step into who God created you to be. You are not defined by your past, limited by your weaknesses, or confined by your circumstances. You are empowered by the Holy Spirit, commissioned by Christ, and backed by Heaven. Isaiah 60 paints a picture of darkness covering the earth, yet God’s glory rising on His people. This is your moment. This is the church’s moment. In a world filled with confusion, fear, and spiritual hunger, God is raising up believers who will shine with courage, compassion, holiness, and power. As you conclude this fast, step forward in faith. Pray boldly. Love deeply. Give generously. Serve faithfully. Speak courageously. Live purposefully.

Arise — your light has come.

Arise — your season is here.

Arise — and do greater things for the glory of God.

1. Thank God for all He has done during these 21 days, giving thanks in all circumstances, for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thess. 5:18
2. Pray that God will help you to arise into the fullness of your calling, for the Lord will fulfill His purpose for you. Psalm 138:8
3. Pray that God’s glory will shines through your life everywhere you go in 2026, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light. 1 Peter 2:9
4. Pray for empowerment to walk daily in obedience and faith, always remembering that we walk by faith and not by sight. 2 Corinthians 5:7
5. Declare that you are a vessel of revival in your home, church, and community, a vessel for honor for the Master, prepared for every good work. 2 Tim. 2:21
6. Believe for the greater works of Jesus to manifest through you throughout 2025, for whoever believes in Him will do the works He has been doing, and even greater things than these. John 14:12
7. Pray that God will continue to use AHOWFC to shine His light to the nations, making us a light for the Gentiles that we may bring salvation to the ends of the earth. Acts 13:47.
